The Political Observatory is a non-profit research association dedicated to the field of political studies. The Political Observatory was created in 2009 by the Scientific Council of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities of the New University of Lisbon. The development of a wide range of academic and scientific activities (research projects, exchange programs, seminars and conferences, publication of the *Portuguese Political Science Review*) led the Political Observatory to acquire an autonomous status working in cooperation with a considerable number of other Portuguese universities. 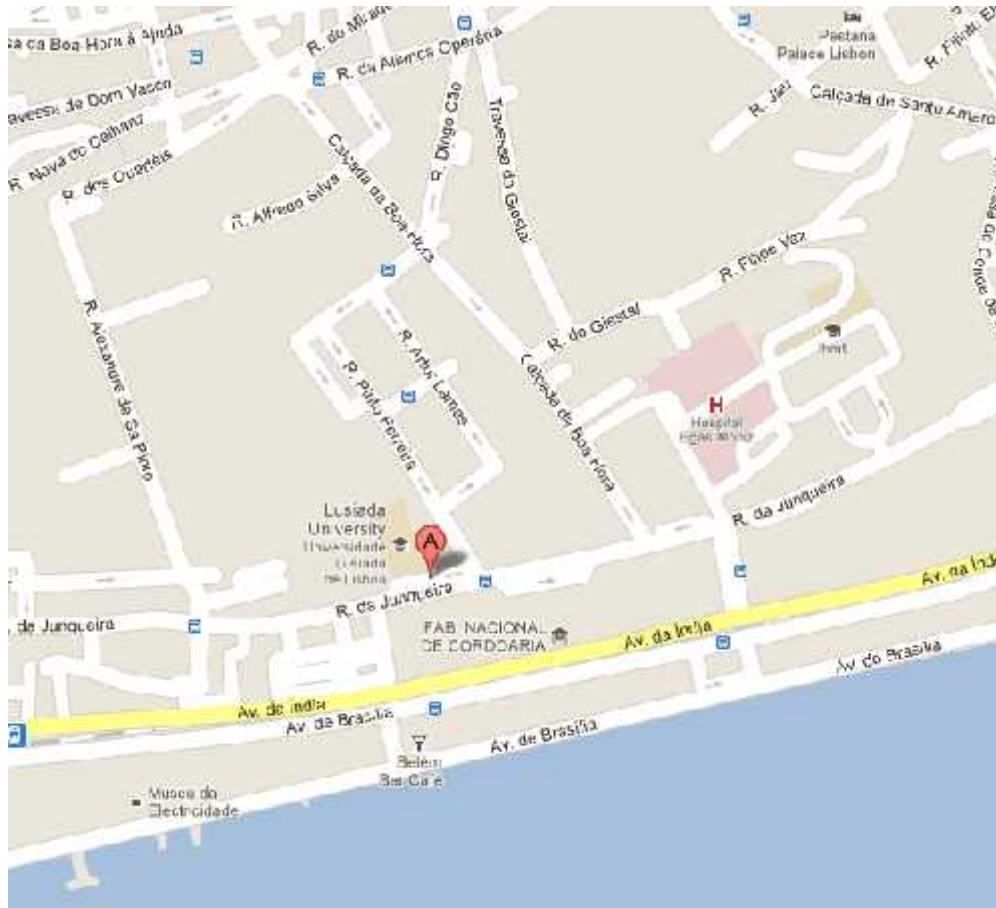
