Lisbon a multicultural city

Praça do Comércio Ana Fernandes Pinto (CHAM - NOVA FCSH)

Since former times Lisbon was a place where Moorish, Judaic, and Christian interacted, both in dialogue and rupture. All of them fostered political conquest and religious imposition, rooted mundane superstitions and erected heritage landmarks, shaping Lisbon's development. In turn, from the sixteenth century onwards, with the construction of the Portuguese Empire, Lisbon became one of the largest and most important cities in the world. Lisbon fostered a global economy, accommodated people from diverse ethnicities, languages and cultures. Lisbon became a microcosm of the globe.

How did people of each creed inhabited the town? How each creed guaranteed their religious freedom? What meant to be a foreign in this city of the world? Wandering through heritage and city landscape we will discover the legacy of the multiples creeds and people in the construction of Lisbon.

Ana Fernandes Pinto is a researcher at CHAM - Centre for Humanities at NOVA FCSH. She holds a PdD in History of Portuguese maritime Expansion (NOVA FCSH) and she teaches in the Master of History of the Portuguese Empire at NOVA FCSH. She is the founder of Culture in Translation, a brand designed to communicate history though art, culture and heritage. She authored and guide cultural tours in Lisbon for academics, university students and corporate.


We will watch the training and rehearsals where exercises and choreographies of Equestrian Art are performed to music, recreating the charming ambience of the Portuguese court during the 18th century.





Advancing Além Tejo (Alentejo) Palácio Alverca Visit to Casa do Alentejo

Originally built in the 1600s, Alverca Palace was the residence of the Paes de Amaral family, or the viscounts of Alverca. The family coat of arms can still be seen on the façade, but the family abandoned it in the early 1900s, when the building became Lisbon's first casino and nightclub. Later, in 1932, it was turned into a social club for the people of the Alentejo region, and became the "Casa do Alentejo" of today.
